Discussion Questions for A Light in the Dark

- 1. The beginning scene of the novel starts with Sabrina after she has been kidnapped. Why do you think the author chose to begin the novel this way?
- 2. Describe Dez's support system as he tries to deal with Sabrina's disappearance.
- 3. Explain why Dez is somewhat apprehensive to be in the spotlight of Sabrina's search efforts and is initially a little put off by it.
- 4. Describe Sabrina's erractic behavior in the first few months after her attack.
- 5. In what ways is Sabrina unrealistic in her recovery?
- 6. The story has flashbacks of Dez and Sabrina's relationship before her kidnapping-why are those so important?
- 7. How does Dez try to be strong for Sabrina?
- 8. Are there ways in which Dez hinders her progress?
- 9. Do you agree with Sabrina's decision to move out? What are her motivating factors to do so?
- 10. When Dez goes to San Diego, he has a chance to sow a wild oat but he chooses not to. Would you have been disappointed if he had chosen otherwise? Why or why not?
- 11. Alex is a supplemental character who makes a large impact to the story. Explain his significance.
- 12. How has violence played a role in Dez's life?
- 13. Dez and Sabrina are two very different people. What do we learn about her as Dez reflects back on their first meeting that help explain their attraction?
- 14. Why is Sabrina repeatedly drawn to Jeremy Harold?
- 15. What other issues aside from her attack does Sabrina deal with as she recovers?
- 16. Describe Sabrina's relationship with her mother and how it changes in the story.
- 17. Describe Sabrina's sessions with Lyndsie versus Dr. Sam? How do both approaches help her recover?
- 18. A Light in the Dark is a novel that subtly represents the culture of today. Provide examples of this within the novel.
- 19. The novel is set in Oklahoma City. Why is this setting significant to the story?
- 20. What is the significance of her pregnancy at the end?
